KEY ID REQUIREMENTS SOURCES

THE BASICS:

- Wisconsin permits no-excuse absentee voting and early voting.
- Wisconsin has a system for online voter registration. Voters may register by mail and Election Day registration is allowed.
- Voters in Wisconsin are required to present photo identification at the polls.

The potential voter may register at the polls on Election Day. By mail. Up to 20 days before the election. Online. Up to 20 days before the election. To register and vote in Wisconsin, you must:

- Be at least 18 years old. The potential voter can register early if he/she will be 18 years old by or on Election Day.
- Be a United State citizen.
- Have lived in the area for 28 days before the election with no intent of moving.
- The potential voter cannot be currently incarcerated, on parole, or on probation for a felony conviction.

SUMMARY: Wisconsin requires voters to present photo identification (ID) while voting. Accepted forms of ID include Wisconsin driver's licenses, U.S. passports, and U.S. military IDs.

DETAILS: Voters must present valid photo ID when voting. The following forms of ID are acceptable for voting purposes and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election:

- A Wisconsin driver license or identification card
- Military ID card issued by a U.S. uniformed service
- A U.S. passport
- An identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin
- A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university, college or technical college that contains date of issuance, signature of student, and an expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance. (The university, college, or technical college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment.)

These photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes, but must be unexpired:

- A certificate of naturalization that was issued not earlier than two years before the date of Election Day at which it is presented
- A veteran's photo identification card issued by the Veterans Health Administration
- A driving receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days)
- An identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days)
- A temporary identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT through the Identification Petition Process (IDPP) (valid for 180 days)
- A citation or notice of intent to revoke or suspend a Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license that is dated within 60 days of the date of the election.
