<p>Connecticut's constitution does not allow early voting and restricts absentee ballot voting to a handful of specific excuses, like active duty military service, religious beliefs, or sickness. Policymakers allowed anyone to access an absentee ballot during the last two years in an effort to reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● To vote in Connecticut, one must be a U.S. citizen and Connecticut resident who will be at least 18 years old before Election Day.</li><li>● Registration applications can be submitted online or completed via paper forms. Same-day registration is available in Connecticut for general elections, though not for primary elections</li></ul>	<p>The following list of accepted ID was current as of November 2019. First-time voters who registered by mail must present one of the following forms of identification to vote in an election with federal candidates on the ballot:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Copy of a current and valid photo identification with the voter's name and address, or</li><li>● Copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or government document that shows the voter's name and address.</li></ul> <p>Other voters must present one of the following forms of identification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Social security card, or</li><li>● Pre-printed form of identification that shows the voter's name and address, name and signature, or name and photograph.</li></ul>
