<p>On March 27, 2019, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham (D) signed into law a bill enacting same-day voter registration, which was scheduled to go into effect in 2021. The bill also expanded automatic voter registration.</p> <p>Statewide election dates</p> <p>June 7, 2022: Primary November 8, 2022: General election</p> <p>Polling hours: 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● To register to vote in New Mexico, each applicant must be a citizen of the United States, a resident of New Mexico, and at least 18 years old by the time of the next election.</li><li>● Convicted felons who have not completed the terms and conditions of a felony sentence are not eligible to register to vote, and individuals who have been declared mentally incapacitated may not register to vote.</li><li>● Either the New Mexico voter registration form or the national voter registration form may be used to register</li><li>● First-time applicants must attach a valid form of identification to their registration materials.</li></ul>	<p>New Mexico does not require voters to present identification while voting, in most cases.</p> <p>However, if an individual registered to vote for the first time by mail and did not provide verification of his or her identity then, the voter will have to show identification.</p> <p>Those voters can present the following forms of identification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Current and valid photo identification</li><li>● Current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, student identification card, or other government document, including identification issued by an Indian nation, tribe, or pueblo that shows the voter's name and current address</li><li>● Some municipalities require identification when voting in local elections.</li></ul>
