	<p>A qualified voter of North Dakota is a person who:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Is a citizen of the United States;• Is eighteen years or older on the day of election;• Is a resident of North Dakota; and• Is a resident who has resided in the precinct at least thirty days immediately preceding any election; and• Is able to provide a North Dakota driver’s license, nondriver ID, or tribal ID that includes the current residential address and date of birth. <p>If an individual’s valid form of identification does not include all the information required in NDCC § 16.1-01-04.1(2), or the information is not current, the identification must be supplemented by presenting any of the documents as outlined in NDCC § 16.1-01-04.1(3)(b).</p>	<p>North Dakota requires voters to present identification while voting. Identification must include the voter’s name, current North Dakota residential address, and date of birth.^[5]</p> <p>Acceptable forms of voter identification include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Driver’s license• Nondriver’s identification card• Tribal government-issued identification (including those issued by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) for a tribe located in North Dakota, any other tribal agency or entity, or any other document that sets forth the tribal member’s name, date of birth, and current North Dakota residential address)• Long-term care identification certificate (provided by North Dakota facility) <p>If a voter does not have a form of identification that includes his or her current North Dakota residential address or date of birth, the voter can present the following supplemental documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Current utility bill• Current bank statement• Check or a document issued by a federal, state, local, or tribal government (including those issued by BIA for a tribe located in North Dakota, any other tribal agency or entity, or any other document that sets forth the tribal member’s name, date of birth, and current North Dakota residential address)• Paycheck• Student photo ID card from a North Dakota institution containing the student’s photograph and legal name. A printed document on school letterhead containing the student’s name, address, and date of birth must also be presented.• North Dakota residents living outside of the United States can submit a U.S. Passport or Military ID if they do not have another valid form of identification.
