<p>On June 8, 2021, Governor Kim Reynolds signed SF568, making a series of changes to Iowa's absentee/mail-in voting laws. That include, but are not limited to, the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Voter can track the absentee ballot request form and absentee ballot by February 26, 2024.● Where there is a disability, no person other than the registered voter, an individual who lives in the same household can return a completed absentee/mail-in ballot	<p>To vote in Iowa one must be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● a United States citizen● a resident of Iowa● at least 18 years old by Election Day. <p>One may register by completing a form and returning it by mail or in person. Registration is permitted on Election Day with proof of identification</p> <p>https://sos.iowa.gov/</p>	<p>Voters can present the following forms of identification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Iowa voter identification card● Iowa driver's license● Iowa non-operator ID● U.S. military ID or veteran ID● U.S. passport● Tribal ID card/document <p>If a voter does not have one of the IDs listed above, he or she may have another voter vouch for his or her identity.</p>
