<p>Statewide election dates</p> <p>June 28, 2022: Primary November 8, 2022: General election</p> <p>Polling hours: 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. (general elections); primary times vary by county.</p>	<p>To vote in New York, one must be a United States citizen, a resident of the county, city, or village for at least 30 days prior to the election, and at least 18 years old by the date of the election.</p> <p>Individuals who are in prison or on parole for a felony conviction and those who have been declared mentally incompetent by a court are ineligible to register to vote.</p> <p>Registration applications are available at the county board of elections or any agency-based voter registration center.</p> <p>Completed forms returned by mail must be postmarked at least 25 days prior to the election.</p> <p>A registration done in person must be completed at least 25 days prior to the election.</p> <p>Residents may also register to vote online.</p>	<p>New York does not require voters to present identification while voting.</p> <p>If a voter does not provide valid identification at the time of registration, he or she must show identification at the polling place when voting for the first time.</p> <p>Voters can present the following forms of identification:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A current, valid photo ID, including but not limited to a driver's license or a DMV-issued non-driver photo ID</li><li>• A current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document with the voter's name and address</li></ul>
