	Vunited States citizen has the right to vote in federal, and local elections as long as he or she is: A resident of Mississippi and the county, city, or town for 30 days; 18 years of age or older; Not declared mentally incompetent by a court; and, Not convicted in a Mississippi court of arson, armed robbery, bigamy, bribery, carjacking, embezzlement, extortion, felony bad check, felony shoplifting, forgery, larceny, murder, obtaining money or goods under false pretense, perjury, rape, receiving stolen property, robbery, statutory rape, theft, timber larceny, larceny under lease or rental agreement, or unlawful taking of motor vehicle (unless having been pardoned, had rights of citizenship restored by the Governor or had suffrage restored by the Legislature.)	 Mississippi voters are required to present photo identification in order to vote in person. Accepted forms include: a driver's license, U.S. passport, or photo ID issued by a branch or department of the state. Voters can obtain a Mississippi Voter Identification Card for free at any circuit clerk's office in the state.
